1.0 OSUN STATE 2021 BUDGET


In Section 121 of 1999 Constitution, it is required of the Governor to submit a Budget Proposal (Appropriation Bill) for enactment by the State House of Assembly before the end of every financial year. After the State House of Assembly passes the Appropriation Bill and it is assented to by the Governor, then it becomes an Appropriation Law. Hence, the responsibility of the State Budget is between the Executive and the Legislative arms of Government. Year 2021 Budget of Providence of N109.855bn was presented by the Governor of State of Osun, Alh. Isiaka Gboyega Oyetola, on 10th of November, 2020 and signed into law by the Governor on the 22nd of December, 2020.

5.0 THE STATE BUDGET PROCESS


The budget process describes the budget cycle in a fiscal year. Its conception is informed by the MTEF process which has four (4) main components as follow:

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8.0 MAIN FEATURE OF YEAR 2021 BUDGET (BUDGET OF PROVIDENCE)

In its commitment to make year 2021 budget robust, inclusive, participatory and sustainable, the Ministry of Economic Planning and Budget conducted Budget Consultative Forum across the three (3) Senatorial Districts of the State. This was done in line with the specification of the State Fiscal Transparency, Accountability and Sustainability (SFTAS) Program for Result (PforR).

The 2021 Budget of Providence was crafted based on the State of Osun Development Plan (2019-2028), Medium Term Sector Strategy (2021 -2023), the Governor's manifesto, 'Thank you Tour Report', as well as the Citizens' Need Assessment carried out in the thirty(30) Local Governments plus one Area Office of the State to engage citizens and harvest information on their critical areas of needs which enhanced formulation and designing of people oriented policies, programmes and appropriate budgeting that will have impacts on lives of the people.

The meaningful contributions of the citizens therefore formed the basis upon which MTSS (2021-2023) was reviewed and integrated into the year 2021 Budget.





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


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14.0 COMPARISON BETWEEN 2020 APPROVED AND 2021 APPROVED BUDGET ON THE SOURCE OF REVENUE




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

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26.0 KEY DELIVERABLES 26.1 AGRICULTURE SECTOR

A sum of 3.4 billion was allocated to this sector. This is to place Agric-business on a vantage position and make it a veritable tool of economic diversification. In the last two years, the State Government has been working consistently to encourage and develop Agric sector with a view to making Agriculture a veritable means of employment generation for youth and women across the various agricultural value chains. The advent of COVID-19 in the country has also spurred the State into action at making the State food sufficient and providing the needed alternative to the single source of revenue and over dependence on monthly allocation from the Federation Accounts.

In the previous year, various programmes were implemented with a view to boosting Agricultural production in the State. Government shall continue to make agriculture more profitable, attractive and vibrant to enable the State attain self-sufficiency in food production with spill over effects to other States of the Federation.

Some of the successes recorded by the State Government include but not limited to:

- 200,000 hybrid cocoa seedlings were raised and sold to farmers at highly subsidised rate of thirty naira per seedlings, the cheapest in the South-West, under Tree Crop Project. Also, the activities of Osun Rural Access Mobility Programme (O'RAMP) and other infrastructural development initiatives in terms of the expanded road networks and other improved basic social amenities have drastically reduced rural-urban migration and is gradually increasing the attraction of more people into farming in the rural areas for both the educated elite and youths. Therefore, the demand for seedlings through the Ministry of Agriculture and relevant agencies has been on the increase in recent times. Government will not relent on its effort until rural infrastructures are developed across the State.
- distribution of various farm inputs (improved maize seeds, plantain suckers, sprayers and high quality
 cassava stems) free as palliatives to the farmers during Annual Flag Off of Planting Season. The State has
 also collaborated with various institutes such as International Institute for Tropical Agriculture (IITA),
 Cocoa Research Institute of Nigeria (CRIN), National Institute of Horticulture Research and Training
 (NIHORT), Institute of Agriculture research and Training (IAT&T) and many others for a world class
 agriculture development in the State.

The collaborative efforts have further alleviated the sufferings of the farmers as well as increased their access to improved farm inputs as a positive direction in the speedy recovery of the State from the COVID-19 pandemic.


• The Central Bank of Nigeria through Anchor Borrowers Programme to empower 1,899 Cassava Farmers with inputs worth N397, 840,500; 2,096, Maize Farmers to the tune of N315, 448,000, 611 Cotton Farmers to the tune of N114, 193, 048.52, and 193 Cocoa Farmers. The maintenance per hectare is N197, 444. Each farmer is to do three hectares. These interventions have further expanded the food production base for the State, which provides strong hope for achieving the target of enlisting the State as a potential food basket for Nigeria with strong possibilities to provide strong export base for the State.

The Osun Broilers' Out-growers' production scheme has been waxing stronger in the last two years. The Scheme, which started with **twelve (12)** farmers at pilot phase, has increased to **106** participating farmers within the relatively short period, through the support of the State Government. The programme has witnessed **18 cycles** till date and produced over **1,916,000 birds** for the school feeding programme and local consumption in the State. The multiplier effect of this programme is enormous as it has created job opportunities for our people and expanded wealth increase to the participating farmers.


The State has also secured the release of Cottage Poultry Processing Center from the
Federal Government of Nigeria, and efforts are in place by the State Government to
partner with the Poultry Farmers' Association of Nigeria (PFAN), Osun chapter, to monitor
and operate the Center. Also, the Federal Government Apiary at Ilesa has been handed
over to the State. It is expected that these two facilities would provide more jobs for our
citizens when the Centres are fully reformed for better productivity

 The State is one of the 15 States selected to participate in the Livestock Production and Resilience Support Project (LPRSS) which is a World Bank and Federal Government Sponsored Project. It is expected to take off fully in year 2021. Government has allocated 400Hectres of land at Ede for this purpose. Without doubt, this will give strong hope for our youths' engagement in productive activities.

As a fallout of the State Economic Summit of 2019, a prominent organisation —
 Agricultural Traders Welfare Association of Nigeria (ATWA) in collaboration with the
 Federal Ministry of Trade Industries and Investment has contacted the State for the
 establishment of specialised Agricultural Products International Market. To this effect,
 15Hectares of land were allocated for the smooth take off of the project at ljebu-Jesa in
 Oriade Local Government.



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- Also, out of the Thirteen Thousand hectares of land donated to the State Government by the Orangun
 of Ila-Orangun, the State Government is committed to clearing and developing three thousand hectares
 for massive cassava production under a Public Private Partnership (PPP) arrangement. The land, after
 clearing, will be distributed to interested farmers (especially the youth) in the State. Osun State
 Agricultural Development Corporation, OSSADEC, has commenced the land clearing work with its
 recently-refurbished bulldozers and works are on-going.
- As part of post COVID-19 interventions, the State Government is proposing to collaborate with the
 Bank of Agriculture (BoA) to disburse \$\frac{\text{\$\psi}400,000,000}{\text{\$\psi}}\$ for about 2,000 farmers/beneficiaries, especially
 youths and women across the State to subdue the effect of the Pandemic on agricultural productivity
 and to boost financial capability of farmers in the State under Government Guaranteed Agricultural
 Loan Scheme (GGALS).

26.2 EDUCATION SECTOR

Having realised that investment in Education pays the best interest, a sum of 10.7 billion has been budgeted for this sector. Education is a veritable tool for liberating the human mind from ignorance and preventable slavery. It is also the passport to the future. It is a common saying that "tomorrow belongs to those who prepare for it today". Based on these truisms, the State has set up a Committee on Education Policy Review which was headed by Professor Olu Aina to review all the policies relating to the Education Sector in line with the aspiration of the people.


26.2.1 Reforms in the education sector.

Based on Citizens' Needs Assessment Report supported by the United Kingdom Department for International Development (DFID), the widespread yearnings of the people of the State and the Campaign Promises, the present Administration has embarked on major reforms in the Education Sector as highlighted below:

- Return of the School system to the 6-3-3-4 regime in line with the National Policy on Education;
- Identification of Schools by their old uniforms and original names;
- Reactivation of Early Childhood education in the State in consonance with global best practices. The
 resultant effect of this is the enlisting of Osun State among the States to enjoy support from the
 United Nations Investment Children Education Fund (UNICEF).

In the outgoing year, the major contributions recorded include the following:

E-registration of candidates for Basic Education Certificate Examination (BECE) and Unified Promotion Examination (UPE) in conformity with modern global standards. This has eased the coordination of the registration process in a more organised manner and fast tracked the grading process and release of final results. It has also allowed the students a level of exposure to Information and Communication Technology (ICT) as a new direction to embrace global best practices;



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- Downward review of registration fee for BECE/NECO Candidates which has allowed more students to participate in the examinations and consequently a reduction in the number of students drop out;
- Periodic review of textbooks to update the moribund ones in line with the NERDC curriculum as well as the knowledge of teachers and learners for an improved Examination result;
- Recruitment and training of 2,210 O-Meals food vendors by the present administration to serve in
 the Public Primary Schools with the aim of feeding the Pupils with mid-day meals in order to
 improve their retention and reduce the number of out of school children. This initiative has
 enhanced both direct and indirect job creation, given that the food items are purchased from the
 farmers within the State;
- Resuscitation of the State's participation in the activities of the Global Learning and Observation to Benefit Environment (GLOBE) with the aim to have better understanding, sustain and improve environment at local, regional and global levels;
- Organisation of On-line lessons for Pupils/Students and on-line training on Osun School Effectiveness
 and Efficiency Enhancement for teachers and Education Stakeholders during COVID-19 Pandemic
 holiday/lockdown. This has substantially assisted the students to keep up with their learning process
 over the long period of the COVID-19 lockdown which has assisted them to quickly complete the
 sessional activities shortly on their resumption after the ease of the lockdown;
- Review of School Curriculum to achieve value re-orientation and to create a sense of worth in our youth;
- The State presented Master Akintade Abdulahi Akanbi for Young Scientist Presidential Award where
 he later emerged as the winner nationally. This is the testimony of improved service delivery in the
 education sector, which justifies the huge investment of the government in the sector.

26.2.2 TECHNICAL AND VOCATIONAL EDUCATION.

In line with Government commitment to the development of Technical and Vocational Education in the State with a view to equipping our Youths with life skills, the present Administration has revitalised five (5) out of the nine (9) Technical Colleges in the State which are ready for commissioning any time from now. The remaining four (4) are in various stages of completion. These colleges would assist in redirecting the orientation of the new breed of school leavers the opportunities to acquire Technical Skills that will enable them to be more independent rather than searching for white collar jobs which are extremely limited.

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26.3 HEALTH SECTOR

A sum of 10.6 billion was earmarked to this Sector. This is as a result of the irrevocable determination of the present administration to transform the Health Sector of the State in line with international best practices by ensuring the existence of a conducive atmosphere for the delivery of affordable and reliable health care services for the benefit of the good people of the State of Osun. The State Government has completed the rehabilitation, renovation, upgrading and revitalisation of Two Hundred and Eighty-five (285) Primary Healthcare Centres under the Saving One Million Lives (SOMIL) Programme for Results (P for Rs) implementation plan in the State. The aim of this revitalisation is to bring health care delivery nearer to the people, and to reduce unnecessary pressure on the Tertiary Health Facilities. Consequently, all the completed facilities are now providing health services seamlessly. Thus, the level of pressure on the Tertiary Healthcare Providers is reducing drastically. More so, the death record and level of complication attributed to travelling long distance to have access to health services have reduced substantially. The State is however committed to the completion of renovation works on the remaining 47 units before the end of the current fiscal year.

Also, Government is working to ensuring the availability of potable water in the focal health facilities and their immediate community through the successful execution of various contracts for the sinking of motorised boreholes and overhead tanks in these facilities.

As part of Government's efforts to provide affordable and quality health service delivery to people of the State, the present administration has completed the rehabilitation, renovation, upgrading and revitalisation of the General Hospital, Ejigbo in Ejigbo Local Government Area as well as General Hospital, Ifetedo in Ife South Local Government Area. The gesture will eventually cover the Nine (9) State/General Hospitals in the coming year.

Also, a 120 Bed Wards and 30 units of Doctors' Quarter in the State's General Hospital, Asubiaro have been completed, commissioned and put to use. In addition, government has completed the rehabilitation and renovation of the Trauma Centre, New Theatre Complex, Children Ward, Main Laboratory, Blood Bank Building as well as the Surgical Ward of the hospital as part of facility maintenance project.

The State also has a Public Health Emergency Operations Centre connected to the National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) in the Ministry of Health for effective coordination of disease outbreak response activities and better response to any public health emergency by relevant health authorities in the State. No doubt Osun has been widely applauded as one of the few States of the Federation that took the bull by the horns at the outset of the pandemic by activating its health emergency response mechanism which culminated in the establishment of the State of Osun Covid-19 Task Force under my leadership of the Governor with a delegated authority to the Deputy Governor.

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This proactive measure stood government in good stead in its effective Management and handling of the well-known case of the 127 returnees from Cote D'Ivoire without any hitch. The timely completion of rehabilitation, renovation, upgrading and revitalisation works at our General Hospital in Ejigbo also afforded government the opportunity to convert part of the hospital to a fully-equipped 130-bed Isolation Centre for the treatment of few of the returnees who tested positive for the virus and other COVID-19 patients. Other measures taken by government to increase the capacity for the care of COVID-19 patients in the State include the conversion of the male surgical ward and part of the new theatre complex of the State Specialist Hospital, Asubiaro, Osogbo to a fully-equipped 20-bed Isolation Centre and an 8-bed Intensive Care Unit (ICU) respectively, conversion of part of Mercy Land Hospital, Osogbo, to a fully-equipped 180-bed Isolation Centre as well as the conversion of the Dermatology Clinic at the Obafemi Awolowo University Teaching Hospital, Ile-Ife to a fully-equipped 16-bed Isolation Centre.

Government has been able to create/establish Isolation Centres across the three Senatorial Districts of the State with a 350-bed capacity. These Isolation Centres are well equipped with diverse medical equipment such as ventilators, dialysis machine, manual defibrillator, ECG machine, portable ultrasound scanner, personal protective equipment, medical consumables (like hand sanitisers, nose masks etc.) and other essential drugs to support the must-win fight against COVID-19 pandemic in our dear State.

As part of its commitment to improve welfare of Health Workers who are in forefront to win war against COVID-19, the State Government has approved the implementation of payment of 100 per cent Consolidated Medical Salary Scale (CONMESS) as well as Consolidated Health Salary Scale (CONMESS) for health workers in the State with effect from February, 2020. This is hope to renewed their commitment to excellent health service delivery in the State.

In a bid to reduce out-of-pocket expenses and ensure that no one is left out in health care delivery system, Osun Health Insurance Scheme was put in place for effective and efficient health care delivery in the State. State Government's achievements recorded in the outgoing year are:

- Remittance of 3 per cent government contribution to the insurance premium of Public Servants in State and Local Government Services;
- Payment of over N500 Million for the provision of quality health services to the workers and their dependants, covering One Hundred and Sixty-Seven Thousand (167,000) who are receiving healthcare services in health facilities of their choice across the State:
- Enrolment of over 2,000 self-employed residents who are currently enjoying variety of services, ranging from treatment of minor ailments to major surgical operations with payment of an annual premium of just Two Thousand, and Sixty-Six Naira(N2,066);
- 2,420 vulnerable persons have enjoyed access to quality healthcare in year 2020 without having to pay a kobo under the Scheme;
- Over 27,000 vulnerable persons whose documentation has completed have started receiving treatment before the end of year 2020 through Equity Grant released to the Agency;

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- 332 Primary Health Centres, 17 government Secondary Health facilities, including LAUTECH Teaching Hospital, as well as 67 private hospitals are now accredited by Osun Health Insurance Agency (OSHIA) with some of them receiving as much as N3,000,000.00 as Capitation from the Agency monthly in respect of the number of their enrolees';
- Release of **A**25, 000,000.00 from the Agency's funds to establish the O'HIS Drug Distribution Centre for sustainable supply to government hospitals accredited under the Scheme;

26.4 INFRASTRUCTURE SECTOR

A sum of 4.3 billion was allocated to this sector. This is to meet some of infrastructural demands made by citizens during Town Hall meetings of the Budget Consultative Forum, Citizens' needs assessment and thank you tour across the nooks and crannies of the State of Osun. Notable among these developmental activities are:

- The Construction of 13.15km Ada-Igbajo road;
- The full reconstruction of 8.1km Moro-Yakoyo-Ipetumodu-Asipa-Ife/Ibadan express way.
- Rehabilitation of Moro/Yakoyo/Ipetumodu road;
- The reconstruction of 4.3 Ereja Roundabout-Isaare-Oke Oye-Irojo-Ilesa/Akure express way;
- Construction of Aagba Township road as well as that of Itaasin (St. Stephen's Church)- Our Lady's School-Police Divisional Headquarters Famia Raod Modakeke;
- Reconstruction of 3.8km Ejigbo Township road;
- 80 per cent completion of the construction of Oba Adesoji Aderemi (East by Pass) Road at Osogbo, from Dele Yes Sir to Ataoja School to Garage Ilesa to Osogbo Stadium;
- 53% completion of the Dualisation of Osogbo-lkirun-lla Odo-Kwara State Boundary which work is on-going:
- Rehabilitation of 470 metres Akinlade Street; 325metres Adewale-Adejumo Street; WAEC-Awosuru Street, and 725metres Oremeji-Akindeko Street all in Alekuwodo, Osogbo;
- Completion of 650metres Oke Gada-Army Barak Junction (Ede)-Ara-Ejigbo Road.
- Continuing dualisation of Gbongan-Akoda Dual carriage way, as well as Old Garage (Osogbo)lkirun-lla-Odo-Erinle (KWSB). These are Federal Roads that span a total length of 66.8 km.

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The massive road construction across the State has significantly opened up the State for ease of business operations and has facilitated increased availability of farm produce and reduced farm output wastages. In addition, it has significantly reduced the rural-urban migration, thus allowing more young people to be indifferent in residing either in urban or semi-urban areas with increase interest in farming. The wide road network alongside other infrastructural development such as rural electrification and access to portable water shall increasingly enhance economic diversification and further improve interest in agriculture in the State.

Considering the heavy traffic, frequent accidents and the need to protect and preserve the lives of people of the State, the present administration has embarked on the construction of a Flyover Bridge at the Olaiya Junction, Osogbo. The proposed Flyover is a 4 –Span Bridge which has a total span length 60m with each being 15metres. It has 196 meters approach ramp from Fakunle end, while that of MDS approach ramp is 99.95m, totalling 295.95m length of approach ramp. The total length of the Flyover Bridge is 335m.

In a quest to develop rural and urban communities, the Osun Agency for Community and Social Development Project has succeeded in intervening in four hundred and fifteen (415) communities with five hundred and thirty-four (534) Micro Projects completed which were distributed across seven (7) sectors of education, health, water, transport, rural electrification, social-economy and environment while nineteen (19) Micro Projects are ongoing. These micro projects had cost the total sum of One Billion Eight Hundred and Sixty-two Million Seven Hundred and Nine Thousand Four Hundred and Twenty-nine Naira Ninety-four Kobo (N1,862,709,429.94) with about one million three hundred and three thousand five hundred and seventy-nine (1,303,579) beneficiaries.

In addition to the above, thirty-seven (37) numbers of gender/vulnerable groups have been assisted with one hundred and six group Micro Projects completed while sixteen (16) are ongoing. The projects cost a total sum of Two Hundred and Forty-nine Million Nine Hundred and Forty-six Thousand Four Hundred and Thirty Naira Fifteen Kobo (N249, 946,430.15) with about seven thousand six hundred (7,600) beneficiaries. The total of community and group Micro Projects which have been completed stands at six hundred and forty (640) while thirty-five (35) are ongoing.

State Land/Government Reservation Area (GRA)

- 3.53km of roads in Ilobu Road GRA Extension were constructed and upgraded to asphaltic surface, while the phase II of 0.65km has reached about 20% completion.
- The construction of 800km (0.8km) road within Commercial Hub, opposite city stadium, Osogbo had commenced and now at 65% completion.

On the issuance of Certificate of statutory Right of Occupancy, about One hundred and Seventy-one (171) certificates have been signed, while Three Hundred and Twenty-six applications were advertised in the National Newspapers for the purpose of granting C of O.

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26.5 WATER AND SANITATION SECTOR


A sum of 4.2 billion was allocated to this sector. This is an indication that the present administration will continue to give priority attention to the provision of potable water to the citizens of the State despite the fact that the construction, maintenance and operation of water supply infrastructures are highly capital intensive. The Rehabilitation of Ede Headworks has commenced in the year 2013 and would be completed by the present administration because the Waterworks alone provides potable water to twelve (12) Local Government areas in the State. All moribund waterworks would be re-assessed while concerted efforts shall be made to resuscitate viable ones. Also, the present administration hope to complete the on-going relocation and repairs of damaged pipelines across the State, and consultancy services for the design of Waterworks at Ora, Ajagunlase, Asejire, Ifetedo, Ile-Ife and Iragbiji.

The State Government has commenced the implementation of the State Water Law enacted in the year 2015, with a view to repositioning the Water and Sanitation Sector to meet the yearnings of our people. This is why the State Government deemed it fit to establish Small Towns Water Supply and Sanitation Agency (STOWASA) as well as Osun Water Regulatory Commission (OWRC). While STOWASA would take care of Water Supply and Sanitation services in the Small Towns, OWSRC would be regulating activities in the Water and Sanitation Sector. The activities of the two Agencies would lead to a more efficient and effective service delivery in the Sector, and in addition boost the revenue generation of the State.

In addition, all the EU-UNICEF sponsored rehabilitations of Mini-Water Schemes in Ayedaade and Odo-Otin LGA at Okuku, Igbaye, Inisa/Eko-Ende, Orile-Owu, have been completed and are already in use. Similarly, a new High Lift Pump have been installed at Ede Headworks to boost water supply to Gbongan and Ode-Omu.

26.6 SECURITY, LAW AND JUSTICE

The State of Osun is well known throughout the Federation for the subsisting peace and harmonious relationship thriving within the State. In the light of this, a sum of 134 million was budgeted for this sector. Although, as human society with individual peculiarities, there is bound to be friction among communities, but the State Government has always ensured that there is maintenance of adequate security throughout the length and breadth of the State. It should be noted that there were few cases of kidnapping in the State, but due to the high level of dexterity with which the present administration tackled the issue, the situation is now under control. Presently, the Administration had established the Osun State Security Network Agency and Amotekun Corps which aims at stemming the tides of social vices in the State thereby protecting the lives and property of the people in the State. In the year 2020, the State Government in collaboration with other five states in the South Western part of Nigeria under the aegis of Development Agenda for Western Nigeria (DAWN) had purchased 20 New Pick-up vehicles to enhance adequate security of lives and property through operation 'Amotekun'. Government also provided other logistics to enhance adequate security in the State.



26.7 COMMERCE AND INDUSTRIES

A sum of 1.1 billion was earmarked for this sector. Despite the current economic situation, the Government remain undaunted and resolute to provide sustainable livelihood and economic mainstay for the citizenry, most importantly, the teeming youth population. The flagged off the commencement of the International Trade Centre, Dagbolu which will generate not less than 10,000 new jobs, 80% of which will go to our youths in the State through the Dry Port, Car Marts, sundry commodity merchandises, ware housing and logistics. Also, there will be periodic Trade Fairs and Expos at the Centre where young entrepreneurs can showcase their talents and products, thereby making them employers of labour and empowering them economically.

The State is ready to create local and international Markets for the over fifty-two (52) well-branded, certified and quality assured proudly Osun made products. The efforts will assist in seamlessly taking youth enterprises to the market and ensure youths are not left out in the non-oil export promotion agenda of Government. It will also internationalise and grow youth enterprises.

In line with the State Government's E-commerce and Digital Economic activities, our teeming youths will now focus and divert energy to more productive ventures. They will be employers of labour, instead of searching for white collar jobs. The State Government is planning to provide skills upgrade for 5,000 participants annually out of which 80 per cent are expected to be youths from the State. After the training, each participant will be provided with Seed Loan of N100,000 each through the Bank of Industry (BoI) and other Financial Institutions with which we have collaborations, so that each of them will be able to engage one or two people to have another minimum of 10,000 indirect jobs available for the people. In addition, we are going to provide 250 youths that are artisans with working tools worth N50,000 each in the Year 2021.

The State Government has recently signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with some Multinational Companies and they will soon commence construction works at their Factory Sites in the Free Trade Zone Area. One of these companies is UNIG Infrastructure Company Limited that is expected to commence as soon as possible, the production of tractors and accessories in the State, while the other Company is a Polyethylene Pipes production Firm. All these efforts are expected to generate thousands of jobs which are mostly for the youths in the State.

The State Co-operative College, Ode-Omu is to be renamed and rebranded as College of Cooperatives and Enterprises Studies, and the curriculum reviewed and upgraded to an HND awarding Institution. This will enhance the production of quality Manpower in Cooperative management and Entrepreneurial development, as well as provide more than 10,000 job opportunities for Youths in the State.

26.8 CULTURE AND TOURISM

The State Government is working round the clock to ensure that traditional roles in culture and tourism are effectively discharged. The State Government is providing both technical and financial supports for festivals in towns and communities in the State with a view to exploring those festivals for tourism purposes. Among these are: Isese festival, Osun Osogbo festival, Olojo festival and Iwudeljesa festival. Government sponsors national and international celebrations, such as international language day, World Tourism Day, and others, which we believe will network us to a greater height such as Hosting of UNESCO 6th Edition of Anglophone Regional Course for the Development of World Heritage Nomination Dossiers with delegates

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
from 20 countries from part of the World. Osun partook in national and international events and brought glory and recognition to the State and the country. Specifically, Osun Cultural Troupe, along with three other states in the country, took part in the maiden edition of the June 12 ceremony organised by the Federal Government. Also, the State represented Nigeria at Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo in Edinburgh, Scotland. As a step towards realising tourism status and dream of the State, Government has formally unveiled Karele Oodua Pilgrimage, as well as developed part of the tourism sites based on capacity of the State.

In the year 2021, government shall continue to build on the achievements so far in its efforts to make the State of Osun Nigeria's World Class, first choice cultural-tourism destinations, through cultural-tourism industrialisation. This shall be realised through concerted development of comprehensive support structures for the industrialisation of Osun cultural-tourism assets, resources and opportunities. By so doing, a new business model for the rapid socio-economic transformation of the state of Osun shall be created, using dynamic vehicle of arts, culture and tourism.

In this regard, to regain the space of culture and tourism in the world economic space in the ensuing year, the State has put in place two plans, which hopefully will serve as a foundation of culture and tourism of our dreams and development of culture and tourism supper structure of State vision. Essentially, the plans are short and long term in nature. These plans recognise and accommodate the resolve to drive the State tourism with Public Private Partnerships. Specifically, the State has formulated Osun-Sterling Tourism Vision 30-30 (OSTOV30-30). In year 2020, Sterling Bank declared its intention to support tourism investors in the State. Upon presentation of the State Culture and Tourism master plan to the bank tourism managers with a view to gaining the bank support. Osun is the first State to be considered for such partnership. These interactions led to the development of OSTO Vision 30-30, which basically contains thirty essential tourism Promotion projects, to be jointly accomplished by Osun State and Sterling Bank, in culture and tourism, to celebrate thirty-year anniversary of our state creation, come year 2021. Specifically, through this vision 30-30, our major tourism sites, namely, Olumirin Waterfall, in Oriade Local Government; Ayikunnugba Waterfall, in Ifedayo Local Government; Owala Rivers, in Olorunda Local Government; Igila in Olaoluwa Local Government; Kiriji war sites in Boluwaduro and Obokun Local Governments will receive Government attention, among other projects.

Similarly, the State has put in place a plan, tagged Culture and Tourism for Sustainable Economy (CUTOSEC). The CUTOSEC is the State's new Master Plan for culture and tourism that focuses on the key issues of development in the sector.

These two initiatives, OSTOV 30-30 and CUTOSEC, are non-debt creating initiatives of the government, despite the fact that the bank is participating. The initiatives have received the blessings of African Union Economic and Socio-Cultural Council and notable tourism professionals both in Nigeria and in diaspora. Government will continue to provide security, necessary infrastructure, enabling environment, make land accessible and provide investors friendly model that will give necessary support for the attainment of the goals of these initiatives for the benefits to our communities.



26.9 SOLID MINERALS

Year 2020 witnessed a major reform in solid mineral, from commercialisation to regulations and result-based planning and the outcomes are beginning to materialise.

State Government has started realising some returns on signature bonuses from investors entering into partnership agreements with the State on some of the State's solid mineral titles. One of the Partnerships has concluded its exploration work programme and commercial operations will be starting soon. Another has finished over 50 per cent of its exploration work, while five other partnerships which include a global leader in mining and an off-taker with substantial commercial mining entities are at advanced stages of transaction negotiations.

Also, the State Government has supported the Segilola Fields of the Thor Exploration Company to continue its construction under strict health measures during the COVID lockdown and they are due to commence operations in the second quarter of 2021. This singular effort will bring tremendous growth to the Osun economy. Arising from this, the revenue to government and employment potential for our youth will be substantial.

By the end of 2021 the State is expected to have concluded all transactions with Partners. The State is also expected to be able to announce a Commercial discovery and a development programme for one of the Assets and a timetable to commence commercial operations by the second quarter of 2021

26.10. FINANCE AND REVENUE MOBILISATION

Since the coming on board of the present administration on the 27th November, 2018, the State Government of Osun, has been steadfast in the attainment of Accountability, Transparency, Sustainability, Integrity, Efficiency and Financial Discipline. To further improve transparency and quality in Public Financial management in the State, it is on record that the present administration has passed into Law some Financial Bills, which include the State Audit Bill and Public Financial Management Bill geared towards the promotion of good governance. In addition, a road map for effective service delivery at the Local Government has been developed and approved by the World Bank.

26.10.1 THE STATE FISCAL TRANSPARENCY, ACCOUNTABILITY AND SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAMME FOR RESULTS (SFTAS)

This is a World Bank-assisted Project aimed at supporting States of the Federation to implement the 22-point Fiscal Sustainability Plan and the Open Government Partnership Agenda to strengthen the Fiscal Policies. However, through the transparent and accountable style of the present administration, the State has been able to meet the Eligibility Criteria of this project, which qualified the Osun alongside 24 other States of the Federation for a World Bank Grant.

26.10.2 TREASURY SINGLE ACCOUNT

The State Government of Osun has also embraced the Treasury Single Account (TSA) Policy of the Federal Government in order to bring all Government funds in Bank Accounts within

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the effective control and operational purview of the Treasury to allow centralised, transparent and accountable revenue management in line with the Global Best Practice. All Government Agencies, including State owned Tertiary Institutions had been directed to key into this policy.

26.11. WORKERS WELFARE

The present administration will continue to demonstrate love and commitment to the welfare of the workers. Despite the trying period, Government will not compromise the continuous payment of full salary and allowances of its workforce as and when due. Government shall also ensure monthly payment of pension and gratuity to the Senior Citizens (Retirees) in the State. Similarly, the present Administration will be unrelenting in contributing the 7.5 per cent employer's part of the Contributory Pension to the workers' respective Pension Fund Administrators (PFA), in addition to the 7.5 per cent contribution of workers to the PFA.

As a demonstration of Government's commitment to the welfare of our workers, the State Government recently announced the implementation of the New Minimum Wage with effect from November, 2020 and lifted the embargo on promotion and conversion.

26.12 GROUP LIFE ASSURANCE: Despite the trying period occasioned by the Global Economic Recession, the State Government under the present administration has also instituted a Group Life Assurance Scheme through which claims are paid to the families of officers who died while in active service under the Contributory Pension, in line with Osun State Pension Law 2008.

26.13 YOUTHS AND SPORTS

26.13.1 YOUTHS

When the present administration came on board, the need to have policy to fast track all-round development for our teeming youth population was discovered. To this end, the State have been able to develop Youth Policy document to promote and ensure youth involvement in decision making processes and developmental programmes and projects in the State.

On the Public Workfare (PWF) and Special Grant Transfer (SGT) components of the Osun Youth Empowerment and Social Support Operation (YESSO), a world Bank initiative in conjunction with the State has assisted a total of Ten Thousand, Six Hundred and Eighteen (10,618) beneficiaries for PWF and Fifteen Thousand, Three Hundred and Ninety-Seven (15,397) beneficiaries for SGT spread across the State. Each of the beneficiaries in the two schemes (PWF and SGT) received N7,500 and N20, 000 on monthly and quarterly basis respectively. The Public Work Fare meant for the Youths between 18-45 years old has gone a long way in reducing poverty among the Youth and by extension helped to reduce youths' unrest and other social vices.

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On the other hand, the Special Grant Transfer has assisted the aged and the physically challenged, 65 years and above, to achieve a meaningful life. More so, the State Government has continued to fund the Osun Youth Empowerment Scheme (OYES) with the aim of reducing youth unemployment and developing youths with character and competence. It is therefore worthy of note that Osun is one of the few States in Nigeria which have Youth Policy.

To show the State Government's seriousness and commitment, a sum of **\Pi1,487,110,159.00** has been earmarked for youth related activities in the 2021 Budget proposal. This covers intervention in the following areas:

- Empowerment of youths in tailoring, hairdressing, pastry, soap making, disinfectant and shoe and bag making;
- Engagement of Youth for labour intensive public workfare;
- Skills upgrade and Entrepreneurship Development programme for youths (supported by MSME/BOI Fund);
- Agricultural inputs supports/Distribution (Nigeria Cares);
- Procurement of Agro-processing tools (Nigeria Cares);
- Livestock Productivity and Resilience support;
- Osun Micro credit revolving loan;
- Business support service credit scheme to artisans across the State.

26.13.2 SPORTS

In the area of Sports, the focus of Government is to "catch them young" and therefore make a huge investment in sporting activities. The State has re-channelled the bubbling energy of Osun youths from crime-related vices to much more productive ventures and as such, helped to reduce the crime rate in the State to the barest minimum. The State-owned teams are being repositioned for profitability as the present administration is taking sports as businesses rather than just recreation.

26.13.3 SPECIAL NEEDS

The State Government is desire to include the Vulnerable Groups in the socio-economic activities of the State by improving their health status in collaboration with Berg Live Healthy Foundation, USA to organise a Healthy Food Festival for two-hundred and fifty (250) Persons with Disabilities.

28.0 GLOSSARY

- **Budget** is a financial plan, consciously prepared to cover a specific period of time, usually referred to as a **fiscal year**. It can also be described as an estimate of income (revenue) and spending (expenditure) over a specified period of time. It is an instrument utilized by Government to allocate resources in a more useful and sustainable manner. Therefore, a well-planned budget is of utmost importance for any government to ensure economic stability and growth.
- Citizens' Budget is a simpler and less technical version of the State Government budget specifically designed to present key information in a manner that is understandable and accessible by the general public.
- Recurrent Expenditure is the part of the total government Expenditure meant for monthly payment of salaries of
 government workers, payment of interest on debts and daily running of activities in the Ministries, Departments, and
 Agencies.
- **Personnel Costs** are the part of recurrent expenditure of government used for the payment of salaries and pensions of government workers.
- Overhead costs are the part of the recurrent expenditures of government used for daily or periodic administrative expenses.
- Capital expenditure is the part of government expenditures meant for development projects like hospitals, schools, roads etc in the State.
- **Debt servicing** is the amount of money allocated in the budget for the repayment of principal of domestic and external debts.

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GLOSSARY CONTD.

- Revenue is the total amount generated by the government over a specified period.
- Statutory Allocation is the allocation to the State from the Federal Accounts. It is determined by Federal Account Allocation Committee (FAAC).
- Consolidated Revenue Fund Charge is part of the estimate statutory used to pay salaries of political
 office holders, Pensions Gratuity, benefits to past Governors/Deputy Governors and interest on
 borrowings/debts.
- Value Added Tax (VAT) is a tax placed on products whenever value is added at a stage of production and/or at the point of retail sale.
- Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) is a transparent medium term (typically 3 years) planning and budget formulation process within which the government establishes credible contracts for allocating public resources to their strategic priorities while ensuring overall fiscal discipline.
- Medium Term Fiscal Framework (MTFF) documents fiscal policy objectives, a set of integrated medium-term fiscal policy objectives plus fiscal targets & projections.
- Medium Term Budget Framework (MTBF) documents medium term budget estimates for individual spending agencies based on the state's strategic priorities & in a manner consistent with overall fiscal objectives.
- Medium Term Sector Strategies (MTSS) defines the programmes, projects and activities, as well as associated costings, for the sectors within government.
- **Grant** is one of the government's sources of funds for funding ideas and projects to provide services for the general public.
