


INVESTMENT IN THE HEALTH OF OSUN PEOPLE

Expanding access to healthcare is the crowning of Governor Adeleke's achievement in the last 24 months. Prior to his assumption of office, healthcare service delivery was at its lowest web, denying the people needed healthcare. In the short term, Governor Adeleke initiated the Imole Surgical and Medical Outreach to provide immediate reprieve to the people suffering various health challenge. The medical intervention took place in each of the nine (9) federal constituencies in the state, rendering free surgeries for cataracts, Pterigium, Hernia and some swellings on the body to other medical conditions like hypertension, diabetes, malaria, cough, tuberculosis, and other diseases. No fewer than 50,000 residents of the state has benefited from this initiative, contributing significantly to a healthy population.

On the long term, Governor Adeleke embarked on the rehabilitation of 345 primary healthcare centres (PHCs) in the state. The intervention, which is ongoing has delivered at least, 200 rehabilitated PHCs with the installation of a 24/7 power source and water facility, and the balance of 145 PHCs are undergoing rehabilitation.











EXPANDING COVERAGE FOR UNIVERSAL HEALTHCARE SERVICE FOR PENSIONERS AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES TO GUARANTEE HEALTHY LIVING

In deepening access to healthcare in the state, Governor Adeleke has broaden coverage of the people in a comprehensive healthcare plan. At the start of Governor Adeleke's term, enrolment in health insurance scheme was the exclusive of the formal sector while the informal sector was practically cut-off. To change this unpleasant situation, Governor Adeleke enrolled 3000 Osun residents were enrolled on the Osun Health Insurance Scheme (OHIS) for free in furtherance of sustained efforts to ensure adequate healthcare access for the people.

Thereafter, the entire pensioners in the were enrolled on the scheme to eliminate the personal pressure that those who gave the better part of their lives to the service of the state usually faces in managing their health. Osun is the first state in the entire Nigeria to give a healthcare coverage to its senior citizens. To crown it all, the Adeleke administration extends healthcare coverage to persons with disabilities in the state, bringing to an end the challenges they face in getting healthcare services.

















REPOSITIONING EDUCATION FOR EFFECTIVE LEARNING

When Governor Adeleke came on board in November 27, 2022, the infrastructures of public schools are in a dejected condition and a weary workforce that counted for a poor output in the state's education sector. Within 24 months, things have taken a better shape, as a massive investment in upgrading public schools infrastructure in the state are yielding results.

So far, a total of 631 classrooms with offices in 125 basic schools has been rehablilitated while 323 new classrooms with offices, hall and laboratories in 96 basic schools have been built. Other infrastructures provided in schools across Osun in two years included thirty-nine new six-holes squatting toilets in 39 basic schools, fourty-one boreholes with reticulations in 41 basic schools, thirty motorized deep well water with reticulation and the construction of 30 perimeter fences with metal gate in 30 basic schools. Construction and rehabilitation of schools and related infrastructure in primary and junior schools across the 30 local governments in the state and the area office while the upgrade of EMIS (Educational Management Information System) units in the 31 LGEAs with new laptops and new printers each for effective data collection and data processing for real time school data and information management.

Upskilling for teachers has received much interest. In two years, 200 secondary school teachers and 20 ICT experts have been sponsored to training on REMOTE LEARNING PLATFORM while a total of 1004 school teachers got trained on use of cooperative learning strategy to teach the students for optimum delivery, efficiency and improved productivity. In order to fill vacancies in public schools in the state, the Adeleke administration set out to recruit 5000 teachers on need-based assessment and successful candidates would soon receive letter of engagements.

For tertiary, Governor Adeleke has invested in improving infrastructures and welfare of workers. In Osun State University (UNIOSUN), for instance, Governor Adeleke funded the completion of a 52 office complex in the institution, making him the first Governor since 2011 to execute a project in the institution of learning. In the newly founded University of Ilesa (UNILESA) Governor Adeleke funded the construction of the first ever students' hostel in the institution just as he approved the engagement of over two hundred and thirty (230) temporary staff from the defunct College of Education, Ilesa, to permanent staff at the UNILESA.

On the training of staff, Governor Adeleke has provided the needed support, counting for the training of 137 academic staff Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) at Osun State College of Technology, Esa-Oke and the training of 1120 Family Life and HIV Education/Education for Health and Wellbeing in collaboration with UNESCO, ARFH and UNICEF. The Adeleke administration also revived the indigenous bursary scheme, granting the sum of N20,000 bursary to at least 3,100 indigent students in the 30 local governments, and N105,000 bursary to Osun indigenes in law schools across Nigeria.

Regular distribution of drugs to the primary healthcare centres in Osun State is a common feature under the Adeleke administration in 24 months, making it possible for patients to get drugs for basic ailment in health facilities across the state.

Also, Governor Adeleke collaborated with development partners to provide medical equipment to primary healthcare centres to boost service delivery. The equipments has since been put to use, adding considerably to the improved service that people now enjoys in the facilities.







OPENING UP THE STATE FOR INCREASED ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES BY BUILDING ROADS AND BRIDGES

Upon assumption of office in November 27, 2022, Governor Adeleke inherited a wide infrastructure deficit, posing a serious obstacle to attracting investments. In two years, Governor has invested significant amount of resources in upturning the bad state of road networks in Osun state. So far, the Adeleke administration has built more than 90kms of road with more than 100km more roads at various stages of completion. In addition to this is the construction of overhead bridges in strategic locations and dual carriages to improve connectivity and drive economic growth.

Notable of the infrastructural projects embarked upon by the Adeleke administration is the 10-spanOke-Fia overhead bridge, which will connect with the Old Garage-Lameco dual carriage road in Osogbo, the state capital. In Lameco is a 4-span overhead bridge, also connecting the Old Garage-Lameco dual carriage. In Ile-Ife, Governor Adeleke is building the first ever overhead in the cradle of Yoruba civilization, with some road features that will link the Oni of Ife palace just the Ilesa dual carriage road is ongoing at the moment. In Ede, the Akoda-Baptist-Oke Gada dual carriage road is already a success andwill be commissioned in a matter of days.

The East Bypass road, popularly known as Ona-Baba-Ona, abandoned by the previous administration has been completed and ready for commissioning just as the 10km stretch phase two of Osogbo-Ikirun-Ila Odo-Kwara boundary road. Camp Young-Egbedi-Erin Osun road completed and ready for commissioning as well as Telemu-Ilemowu-Ogbagba I is delivered. 


























In December 2020, the Second Rural Access and Mobility Project (RAAMP-2) closed in Osun state and no effort was made by the previous administration to enlist the state for the third phase of the project. Ittook the coming in office of Governor Adeleke for this to change as he ensured the release of thecounterpart fund, which is a condition to benefit from the project.

In two years, rural road projects accessed through the programme are ongoing and when completed, will enhance the movement of people and farm outputs in the benefiting rural communities. Below are the RAAMP projects ongoing in different parts of Osun state.

Governor Adeleke has transformed governance, ensuring that not only those living in the cities or big towns can enjoy the benefits of social amenities, but also those in the remoteness part of the past. Between November 27, 2022 and now, a total of Two Hundred and Seventy-six (276) socially inclusive micro projects had been completed and being put into uses in different parts of the state. The micro projects, which is distributed along education, health, water and sanitation, and socio-economics, has benefited at least, Two Hundred and Forty-six thousand, Seven Hundred and Thirty-nine (246,739) people, comprising of 122,353 males and 124,386 females including vulnerable people in the society. 
BREATHE LIFE TO AGRICULTURE AND BOLSTER FOOD SECURITY

When Governor Adeleke took office two years ago, agriculture was nearly inexistent due to lack of investment in the sector by the previous administration. In 24 months, the experience has taken a turn for the better as Governor Adeleke unveiled 31 new tractors acquired by the State Government in its effort to ease farming operations in the state. The 31 new tractors with full implements, is just a phase in the effort to boost food production, and the mechanised tools will be released to farmers' cooperative societies and associations after all necessary administrative procedures have been completed. Through the Osun CARES RA2, a total of 8,060 farmers has received agricultural inputs and services, out of which 3,972 were females and 4,088 were males. The inputs distributed consists of improved seed varieties, fertilizers, herbicides, insecticides among others. In two years, at least 80,000 hybrid cashew seedlings were raised and distributed to Osun farmers just as poultry farmers were empowered with several millions of naira through Osun Broiler Outgrowers Production Scheme.


Highlights of the achievements recorded in agriculture in two years

- 1. Acquire of thirty-one (31) new tractors and their implements with the repairing of old tractors for land mechanisation for Osun farmers
- 2. Empowerment of peasant farmers through Osun Covid-19 Action Recovery and Economic Stimulus Programme (OS-CARES)
- 3. Procurement and distribution of agricultural inputs to farmers and schools across the state
- 4. Empowerment of women and persons with disabilities on agricultural project
- 5. Raising and distribution of 80,000 hybrid cashew seedlings for farmers across the state
- 6. Empowerment of livestock farmers across the state through Osun Broiler Outgrowers Production Scheme (OBOPS)
- 7. Empowerment of youth including persons with disabilities across the state with weaner pigs on pig production
- 8. Drafting and validation of gender sensitive agricultural policy of Osun State
- 9. Construction of toilets, vaccination, post mortem inspection, surgical operation and disease control of animals in Osun state
- 10. Disinfection of farms and livestock markets














Under the compassionate leadership of Governor Ademola Adeleke, Osun state is seeing strong commitment to the provision of portable and clean water to residents. Governor Adeleke has concentrated resources to ensuring that people of the state have access to drinkable water in the short and long term. In the short time, Governor Adeleke implemented the installation of a motorized borehole in each of the wards in Osun state, making a total of 332 motorized boreholes in the state.

In the long term, Governor Adeleke has embarked on series of interventions to put our water workstations in good use and delivers portable water to every homes. The Ora-Igbomina water project will soon serve the people in that axis as the contract to make it functional is being executed as we speak. Other efforts to bring portable homes to residents in the state includes the installation of water pipelines in Ede, Osogbo and others, which contributed to the restoration of water to Esa-Oke and environs. Governor Adeleke intervention saved the Ilesa water project from succumbing to the pervasive corruption that was frustrating the successful execution.

- 6. Robust engagement with the Federal Ministry of Water Resources and relevant stakeholders to resolve the delay created by the mismanagement of the Ilesa water










REVIVAL OF COOPERATIVE SOCIETIES AND CREDIT SUPPORT FOR BUSINESSES

Governor Adeleke may have finally found the key to resolving the challenges faced by small scale businesses in the state in accessing credit. In two years, life has been breathe to cooperative societies in the state, making it possible for them to bridge the wide gap in accessing credit by businesses. For a start, Governor Adeleke created the Ministry of Cooperatives and Empowerment on July 19, 2023. This was followed by the renovation and upgrade of the structures of Osun State Cooperative College in Ode-Omu, Ayedaade local government.

In terms of credit support, the Ministry has disbursed N550 million credit to ward cooperatives in the 332 wards in the state, benefiting a total of 11,952 individuals. Another N450 million revolving loan was disbursed to conventional registered cooperative societies in the state under Federation of Osun State Cooperatives Limited (FOSCOOP) and a total number of one hundred and forty-two (142), cooperative societies have benefited so far. Osun indigenes in Abuja and other parts of the North got N50 million credit support to be utilised for their various businesses











BUILDING POWER INFRASTRUCTURE AND RURAL ELECTRIFICATION PROJECT

Upon assumption of office, Governor Adeleke inherited a lot of abandoned projects and one of such is the execution of the Obokun 33KVA Feeder. The project which began in 2013, was however abandoned and this has impacted electricity supply to towns and villages in four local government in the state. The project was revisited and flagged off by Governor Adeleke on August 29, 2024 and still ongoing. The relocation and construction of Obokun 33kv Feeder Line will surely improve the socio-economic activities of the four affected Local Governments namely: part of Ilesa West, part of Atakumosa West, 95% of Obokun Local Government Area and Igbajo in Boluwaduro Local Government

Governor Adeleke recognizes the inherent benefits of a motivated workforce and the implication on his goal of driving development for Osun state. This explains why he made the welfare of workers and pensioners the first on his list of priority. Barely two months of assuming office, Governor Adeleke outlined plans by his administration to offset 30 months half salary owed by previous administration. Nothing was done by his predecessor, Gboyega Oyetola, on the debt for the four years he was in office despite been a part of the government that incurred the debt.

So far, Governor Adeleke had paid seven months out of the 30 months, signaling commitment to pay the rest within the highlighted timeframe. Within twenty-four months, Governor Adeleke has released over N16 billion in bond to pensioners on the contributory pension scheme, an amount that is by far greater than the about N12 billion that the two successive administration of the APC released in twelve (12) years. The Adeleke administration also expended a total of N2.74 billion on the payment of wage award to public workers and pensioners, underscoring commitment to their welfare.

In addition to clearing salary owed by the previous government, Governor Adeleke in April effected the cash backing of promotion done by the past administration. While his predecessor, Gboyega Oyetola, approved the promotion of workers in the state's service, he failed to implement the financial implication that the promotion carries. This was what the Governor did, making sure that a civil servants which had moved to level 9 from level 8 can receive the commensurable money for the new status, and not the old status as was the case in the past.







REFORM CIVIL SERVICE TO ENHANCE **EFFICIENCY AND DELIVER**

At the time when Governor Adeleke took office, the Osun State Civil Service was in a quandary, with undue interference distorting the system and igniting uncertainty. As against the established norms in the civil service, what Governor Adeleke inherited was the unusual introduction of CoordinatingDirectors in the place of Permanent Secretaries. This major desecration and aberration of the public service created an imbalance that put the future of the service in grave danger. However, Governor Adeleke corrected the mishomer by appointing Permanent Secretaries, hence, restoring the right order and saving the public service from destruction. In arriving at the Permanent Secretaries, Governor Adeleke ensured that due process was strictly followed and there was strong consideration for merit. This led to the appointment of Permanent Secretaries acceptable to all, and enhanced efficiency in the service.



IMPLEMENTING MECHANISM FOR SAFER PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Upon his assumption of office, Governor Adeleke upgraded the Office of Transportation to a full fledged Ministry to strengthen efforts to achieve a safer public transportation in the state. As of now, the public transportation has undergone a lot of changes, making sure that they are not only safe for the public, but also drive revenue generation for the state. Below are some of the highlights of achievements recorded in the transportation sector so far

- UPGRADING THE OFFICE OF TRANSPORTATION: The defunct Office of Transportation was upgraded to the Ministry of Transportation for world best practices in transportation sectors.
- ESTABLISHMENT OF COMPUTERIZED TESTING STATION: Computerization Testing station was established on PPP basis to checkmate unworthy vehicles on our roads in the State to reduce crashes/accidents.
- INTRODUCTION OF DRIVERS THEORY TESTING (DTT): Drivers Theory Testing (DTT) was established in all the FRSC Capturing Centres in the State to improve the issuance of drivers' license to qualified driversin the State.
- DEPLOYMENT OF OSUN STATE TRAFFIC MARSHALS: Osun State Government approved deployment of Traffic Marshals to ensure free flow of traffic on major roads in the State. The impacts of these Traffic Marshals can be felt in the following areas:

(a) Control of traffic at critical points, junctions and inter-sections;

(b) Introduction and effective manning of one-way system along the post office axis to

reduce traffic delays and other areas;

(c) Prohibition of arbitrary parking and riding against the flow of traffic through the introduction of appropriate traffic light and camera at Olaiya axis and other areas in

Osogbo;
(d) Introduction of riders jacket and enumeration of all commercial vehicles, tricycles. This has assisted the government in reducing the nefarious activities of kidnappers, armed robbers and bag snatchers in the State. – IMOLE DE PALLIATIVE BUS INITIATIVE: "Transformation of "Omoluabi Scholar Buses" to "Imole De Buses": Under the visionary leadership of Mr. Governor, our Ministry has undertaken significant initiatives to enhance transportation services and governance in Osun State. The Ministry has diligently carried



out repair and rebranding work on 19 'Omoluabi Scholar Buses,' which was recently unveiled as 'Imole De Buses.' Presently, the Buses have started operation in some major cities in the State, namely; Osogbo, Ede, Ife, Modakeke, etc. while plans are underway for the extension of these service other cities in the State. These Buses not carrying the pupils and students safely to their schools, they also convey civil servants to their places of work and other members of the public to their respective destinations. This thoughtful initiative serves as a timely palliative for the citizens, particularly during this period of fuel subsidy removal and also as empowerment scheme to the Staffers engaged to man the said Buses."

- COMPRESSED NATURAL GAS (CNG) CONVERSION AND ADOPTION INITIATIVE: The State has been in a public private partnership talks with three companies including a local CNG firm when concluded, it is believed that the effort will be of great benefit to the people of the State. The Imole Buses currently plying Osun roads as palliative transport service will soon be converted to the CNG model while Osun is also billed to benefit from federal initiative on the CNG adoption. The plan also includes dedicated charging points as well as PPP acquisition of CNG powered buses to expand the transport palliative in operation across the state.

- OSUN STATE TRANSPORT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (OSTMS):
This is a one-system ticketing approach across the State for Commercial Transporters (Motor VehiclemWing and Cycle Wing) with triple objectives:
a.) Securing Motor Parks; b.) Job Creations for the ticketers; and c. Improved Revenue Generation.

The Establishment of Ministry of Transport has considerably enhanced the revenue generation of the State in the Transport Sector.







REFURBISHMENT OF ABUJA AND LAGOS LIAISON OFFICES

During the transition period, government buildings were descended on and stripped of valuables. Abuja liaison officer was worse hit as looting of valuables left the facility almost empty and incapable of serving its purpose for the state at the country's capital. In the case of the Lagos House, years of neglectdiminished the worth of the building. Within 10-month of being in office, Governor Adeleke undertook a major renovation of the two important assets of the state, restoring their values and purpose for Osun State. While the Abuja liaison office has been refurbished to reflect its importance for Osun State in the federal capital territory, the Lagos House has received infrastructural facelift to continue to serve its purpose for the state.



REVITALISATION OSBC BY PROCURING EQUIPMENT

Governor Adeleke has made significant investment in the State Broadcasting outfit to meet up with peers. In December 2022, the Adeleke administration paid for the hosting of the OSBC TV Channel on the SES 5E satellite subscription platform, covering accumulated arrears between January 2022 and January 2023. In February 2024, Governor Adeleke splash N1.2 billion to procure digital equipments and transmitters for the three station under the OSBC conglomerate







Governor Ademola Adeleke has shown remarkable commitment to deepening internet penetration in the state, concentrating significant investments in improving infrastructures to enhance connectivity and unlock its true potential for Osun state. Within the first 100 days in office, Governor Adeleke unveiled Osun Tech Innovation Policy. In addition, Governor Adeleke initiated process to become the first domesticate the Nigerian StartUps Act in a sustained effort to enhance both the ICT and the tech innovation in

Governor Adeleke pursued an ambitious digital economy goal, launching the Osun Google Mapping project to increase the visibility of the state and businesses on the global map. At the time of coming into office, Osun coverage on the Google map was below 30 percent, but in six months, had grown to nearly 60 percent. This has attracted the interest of Google PLC and talks are ongoing on a partnership with the State Government that would benefit both businesses and citizens in the state. Additionally, Governor Adeleke has championed the expansion of broadband internet access. Governor Adeleke has championed the expansion of broadband internet access, launching the Osun State Broadband Fiber Optic Project by signing a Memorandum of Understanding with Oodua Infraco for the deployment of Fibre Optics across Osun state. The first phase of the project is to cover 64 kilometers covering key and economic active towns in the state, and at no cost to the State Government.

These infrastructural commitment has bolstered the prospect of the State and position it at an advantage to tap from the trillian dellars digital economy. it at an advantage to tap from the trillion-dollars digital economy.
